

This prayer is about *connection* - connection to creation and connection to all efforts for ecological justice.

In the following quote from Laudato Si' ponder and/or discuss what might be meant by 'ecological virtues'?

"The Spirit of Life dwells in every living creature and calls us to enter into relationship with God. Discovering this presence leads us to cultivate the ecological virtues" (Laudato Si' # 88)

The Season of Creation closes on Oct 4<sup>th</sup>, Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, patron saint of the environment. Francis of Assisi stands out for his loving sense of connection and blessing of fellow creatures.

As St Francis recognised centuries ago, we human and non-human, are interrelated as members of God's family of creation. We are interconnected with all of creation.

Job reminds us, "the creeping things of the earth will give you lessons, and the fishes of the sea will tell you all; there is not one such creature but will know this state of things is all of God's own making..." (Job 12:8)



Question for reflection:

The beasts, birds, plants, and fish show us ecologically sound ways to build a relationship with all other species on the earth.
